History



- → 1876 German Design Model Law
- → 1877 German Patent Act
- 1900 Act governing Patent Attorneys
- → 1934 Establishment of the Chamber of Patent Attorneys (Patentanwaltskammer - PAK)
- → 1966 Revision of the Patent Attorneys` Act: "independent constituent of the legal system"

Recent History

- → 1990 German Unification Treaty
- → 1998 introduction of an obligatory study of general law for patent attorney candidates
- 2002 establishment of the Kurt-Haertel-Institute for intellectual property
- 2003 new Master study "European Intellectual Property" for patent attorneys
- 2009 Transfer of the competence for the admission of patent attorneys to the Chamber

Chamber of Patent Attorneys (§ 53 PAO)

- Self-governing federal corporation under public law
- Located in Munich
- Representation of the interests of all German patent attorneys
- Governed by the Patent Attorneys` Act

Membership

- → Membership is obligatory
- → Presently about 3400 members
- → Admission of new patent attorneys by the Patentanwaltskammer since 2009
- → Financed exclusively by membership fees

- Meetings of the Assembly take place twice a year in different locations.


Main Tasks of the Assembly


- Composed of 18 patent attorneys

- Mediation in disputes between client and patent attorney
- Involvement in national and international legislative projects
- → Cooperation with the Federal Ministry of Justice, the European Commission, members of Parliament, the Courts and the Offices

How to become a German Patent Attorney


Characteristics of the profession of German Patent Attorneys

- Free and independent profession
- "Translators" between law, technic and science
- Advisors and representatives of inventors and businesses in all intellectual property matters
- Advisors and/or representatives on national, European and international basis

Right of Representation of German Patent Attorneys

- German Patent and Trademark Office
- Federal Patent Court
- Federal Supreme Court (nullity proceedings)
- Litigation proceedings (together with an Attorney at Law): District Court, Higher Regional Court and Federal Supreme Court
- OHIM
- With additional admission: EPO

Educational Background Requirements



- → Technical education: scientific or technical study at a university with a corresponding degree e.g. in chemistry, physics, mechanical engineering, electrical engineering, biology etc.)
- One year practical experience in the technical field of the university education

Training for Patent Attorney Candidates

Time course:

- 26 months at a patent attorney 's office or with a patent agent in industry (training on the job)
- 8 months at the German Patent and Trademark Office and Patent Court
- Examination at the German Patent and Trademark Office
- Admission as patent attorney

Accompanying legal training

- Accompanying obligatory study of general law at the Distance University Hagen
- Topics: civil law, commercial law, labour legislation, corporate law, administrative law, public law, anti-trust law, competition law, procedural law, laws of the EC

Training at the German Patent and Trademark Office and Federal Patent Court

- German Patent and Trademark Office (2 months):
 - everyday work experience with a patent and a trademark examiner
 - seminars in patent and trademark law
- Federal Patent Court (6 months):
 - 2 months at a trademark board
 - 4 months with different boards: technical board, utility model board, nullity board and legal board
 - Accompanying seminars on law and examination writing skills

Continuing professional training for Patent Attorneys



- Seminars held on occasion of the meeting of the assembly of patent attorneys
- Seminars provided by private companies on various topics concerning intellectual property law
- Literature: e.g. court decisions and journals
- New program of study at the FernUniversität Hagen: European Intellectual Property Law (Hagen II) for Patent Attorneys and European Representatives
